Local Stops Mass Shooting

In Morenci two days ago, an as yet unidentified woman, bent on performing a mass murder at the Kopper Kettle Kafe, was stopped by a good citizen that happened to be at the right place at the right time.

When Deputy Blackman arrived at the scene that evening, he found two women and a man dead from gunshot wounds. Two additional gunshot victims: 53 year old Jeffrey Brown, and 37 year old Faith Armstrong, had already been transported to Gila Health Resources via private vehicles. They are expected to recover.

Eye witnesses of the shootings claim that an unknown woman entered the Kopper Kettle, and at some point began shooting people with a hand gun. Two Morenci residents were killed: Marcus Herrington, age 34, and his wife, Edna, age 22. At some point during this shooting spree, the red haired female in her 40's or 50's stopped to reloaded her handgun. It was at this point that Morenci resident Gerard Hanson fired upon the
